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NMN Members Reach Out to Help

Ever traveled eight hours in a dusty, crowded van down bumpy dirt roads that teeter on the edge of a 40 foot drop? Ever dared to lie down in bed and actually close your eyes after just squashing a spider the size of your hand on the wall? Ever do either of these things willingly because it allowed you to help those in need? Patty Doherty and Teresa Borak, both nurses at Sawtooth Mountain Clinic would say “Yes!” with enthusiasm to all three of these questions.

Once a year, Patty and Teresa and the rest of their “team” (a General Surgeon and an OB-GYN) traverse the bumpy dirt roads of Guatemala with Partner for Surgery, a non-profit organization based in Virginia and Guatemala, committed to helping impoverished, rural Guatemalans get access to much needed medical care.

Patty, Teresa and their team spend a week in Guatemala, visiting some of the most rural communities in the country to set up the temporary clinics that will bring this much needed care to the people. Over the course of a week, the team fields four different clinics and cares for over 500 patients.

This Month's Technology Tips

File Extensions

When you save a file on your computer it will automatically get a “.” and a 3 letter extension added to it.
i.e. Document.doc

The following are common file extensions:

- .doc or .docx is a Word Document
- .ppt or .pptx is a Power Point
- .xls or .xlsx is an Excel Spreadsheet
- .pdf is an Portable Document Format (typically opened with Adobe Reader)
- .url is an Internet Shortcut
- .lnk is a Link Shortcut
- .jpg, .png, or .gif are Image extensions
- .mpg is a movie or animation file
- .mp3 or .wav is an Sound or Music file
- .htm is a Web page
- .zip is an Archived or Compressed file
- .rtf is a Rich Text document (opens with Word)



The process isn't all that different from what you might see here in the USA. Patty and Teresa listen to the patients: they gather a health history, they ask the patient to describe symptoms and then they assess them. If they assess the patient might be a candidate for surgery, the patient is then seen by one of the doctors on the team. From there, the patient's need is either acutely met or, if surgery is indeed a necessity, a referral is immediately established and the patient is connected with a Guatemalan Health Promoter employed by Partner for Surgery who facilitates travel, follow up and other logistics for the surgery, ensuring there are no gaps in the patient's care. "We see a lot of things you would never see in the US because it would have been taken care of immediately." Patty says. "Things like 17 year-olds with cleft lip and palate or women who have been living with a prolapsed uterus for years."

This process doesn't come easy though—there are many hurdles. For one, the Guatemalan patients don't speak English and in most cases, not even Spanish. "They speak one of the 32 dialects of Mayan," says Teresa. "We rely a lot on our translators." But the effort is worth it—during their last visit there, 150 people were set-up to receive much needed surgery.



"We've been doing this for eight years," says Patty. "I don't see us stopping any time soon. Partner for Surgery is an extremely effective organization, helping countless indigenous people in Guatemala to access the health care they deserve."
