**C**ongratulations to member Scenic Rivers Health Services on their HRSA grant award to open a New Access Point medical and dental health center in Tower, Minnesota. Wonderful news! The Tower-Soudan area has not had a health center for over nine years, since the Tower Clinic closed. Residents traveled nearly 30 miles across rural roads to the nearest primary care facilities. Beginning in the Fall of 2012, residents will have access to health care services in their own community thanks to SRHS.

Network activities this quarter focus on system upgrades, EHR implementations, optimization work and health information exchange (HIE) initiatives. Two members completed upgrades to their electronic dental records systems. Scenic Rivers Health Services upgraded to Dentrax 6.0 and Lake Superior Community Health Center transitioned to Dexis Imaging.

The EHR Core Team at CHP of Illinois is involved with preload work, interface planning and EHR implementation activities. Migrant Health Services, Inc. is nearly done with phase one of their HIE project for record locator services. The next phase for MHSI and our other members is to implement a Continuity of Care Document (CCD) application for HIE with other organizations. This phase kicks off this month with HIE planning efforts.

# Beware of Malware

There are many types of Malware. Two of the most popular types are Spyware and Adware.

Spyware is a type malware, malicious software, that get installed on your computer and collects information about you without your knowledge.

Adware is a type of malware that automatically renders advertisements. This can be in the form of a pop-up or in an user interface.

There are several ways that these types of malware can infect your pc. Unlike viruses and Trojans, they will not attempt to transmit form pc to pc. Instead, these get installed on the pc through deception or through exploitation of software vulnerabilities.

To prevent infections from spyware or adware, only install programs from trusted sources. A lot of programs are bundled with malware. Kazaa would be an example of this. Malware also disguises itself as a useful utility- for instance as a “web accelerator” or even as a security software.

(Continued from page 2) She also interviews border patrol teams, medical rescue units, residents of southern Arizona and organizations offering support and opposition on both sides of the border. Also discussed are the trade and economic policies of many governments which force Latino people to leave their homelands. This is a complex problem which offers no easy solutions.

The book read soon expanded to include most of the catholic churches in Rochester, the Rochester Public Library and the Land Stewardship Project of Southeastern Minnesota. We invited the author to travel from Arizona to lead discussions and by the end of April, 2012, three sites were hosting and over 300 participates. This has created the incentive to organize future events to address migrant issues and an ongoing community support group for Hispanic people in our area.
